
# Folios and Portfolios: Oversized books have an F (folio) or PF (portfolio) at the end of the call number and are usually shelved at the end of the classification.

This prefix is used in both the LIBRARY OF CONGRESS and OLD WIDENER systems.


Offsite: This classification is located at HARVARD DEPOSITORY or another library. If these items are listed as located in Widener, fill out a Tracing Request form at Circulation.

### HARVARD DEPOSITORY (OFFSITE STORAGE)

To retrieve a book from the depository via HOLLIS online [hollis.harvard.edu], select the <u>Availability</u> link, select <u>request</u>, enter your Harvard PIN data, then confirm with "Send Request" button. The book is usually available the next business day at Circulation. When "request" is not an option, fill out a **Tracing Request** form at Circulation.



## How to Find Books in the Widener Stacks



#### **Understanding the Layout of the Stacks**

The Widener stacks are laid out in two halves: East and West. Stacks level 1 is even with the First Floor of the building. Above level 1 rise levels 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. Below level 1 are levels A, B, C, and D. Levels A, B, and C do not connect between East and West. Some Widener materials are located in Pusey Library, which is an underground facility located to the east of Widener. A tunnel leads from the level-D East elevator into Pusey, level 2.

#### **Entering the Widener Stacks**

The main entrance to the stacks is on the First Floor though Circulation, Room 160. This entrance leads directly to stacks level 1-East and the East stacks elevator and stairs, which provides access to all other Widener stacks levels.

#### Find the Call Number in HOLLIS

Bibliographic information can be accessed in HOLLIS, the Harvard Online Library Information System. Computers are available in Circulation, the Periodicals Reading Room, the Phillips Reading Room, the Atkins Reference Room, the Newspaper Microfilm Reading Room, and throughout the stacks. For assistance, consult staff in the reading rooms, at the Reference Desk on the Second Floor, or at the Information Desk on the First Floor.

#### **Knowing the Difference Between the Two Call Number Systems**

Note that Widener uses two primary classification systems to shelve books: the Old Widener System and the Library of Congress System, the latter indicated by call numbers that begin with WID-LC. When you are looking for a book in the stacks, it is important to be aware that the call numbers progress differently within each classification.

In LIBRARY OF CONGRESS classes, known as WID-LC at Widener Library, call numbers are separated by periods that *do* confer a decimal value and progress as follows:

In the OLD WIDENER System, call numbers contain whole numbers and are separated by periods that *do not* confer a decimal value and progress as follows:

BP BP BP 819.7 819.8 819.25

About two dozen class names appear in *both* the Old Widener and the Library of Congress systems (as with BP above).

#### Checking the "Widener Call Number Locations" Chart

The Widener Call Number Locations" chart lists where call numbers are shelved in the stacks. This information is posted at the stacks entrance and throughout the stacks. Handouts are also available at Reference, the Information Desk, Circulation, reading rooms, and online as a PDF file at hcl.harvard.edu/widener/docs/LocChart.pdf.

*Please note*: If you are looking for a periodical issue that was published in the past year, it may not yet be bound and in the stacks. For unbound, current periodical issues, check the Periodicals Reading Room and the adjoining Per RR stacks.
